Healthy Lifestyles for Harlem Kids

The purpose of this project is to teach Harlem kids at a young age how to fit healthful, balanced, low-fat, low-sugar nutrition into their daily diet in easy, fun, and delicious ways and how to make regular physical activity another fun and easy part of their daily routine to promote healthful living and lower weight and diabetes risk factors in this at-risk population. In the parental information portion, the purpose is to educate the parents of the Harlem elementary schoolers on how to help their child and the rest of their family adopt a healthier lifestyle using the recipes, information, and activities suggested in the program. It will also show parents how they can help to make these changes while shopping at their usual local grocery stores and corner markets, and within the context of their budgetary restrictions and cultural values.

Herpes Zoster Vaccination and Screening in an Elderly Apartment Complex

My project is intended to screen patients seen at the Squirrel Hill Health Center that reside in Riverview Towers, elderly apartment complex in the same community, to both administer the vaccination and make it affordable for those patients.

The Role of Community Pharmacies in Addressing Public Health Needs in Health Care Professional Shortage Areas in Indiana: A Qualitative Analysis of the Community Pharmacist Perspective

The goals of this project are to determine the perception of community pharmacists in full county HPSAs within the state of Indiana with regard to the following community health issues: the present need, demand, and frequency of additional pharmacist-provided community health activities, the role of the pharmacist in community health, and the barriers to providing additional community health activities. In addition this project will assess potential opportunities for both community pharmacies and Butler University to actively address community health needs in selected areas in the state of Indiana.

I will be working with the Asian Heart and Vascular Center at University of California in San Francisco to provide health care workshops to promote health care wellness and prevention.

My Paul Ambrose Scholars Project will encompass my interest in education and awareness about Glaucoma, the leading cause of blindness in the world today. I plan to serve at-risk populations, which include the medically under-served and elderly communities, surrounding the Yale-New Haven area about the major risk factors that could lead to permanent blindness. Presentations will be made to individuals in community centers, churches and elderly nursing homes about the causes of Glaucoma, the awareness of major risk factors and the importance of annual eye screenings. Most importantly, all individuals at-risk for Glaucoma will be followed-up and encouraged to get screened at Yale SSSP's own free Glaucoma screenings or by a local free clinic in the area.

Psychiatric Services for the Uninsured

The University of Alabama School of Medicine (UASOM) and MPower Ministries, a Birmingham non-profit medical clinic, partnered in the Spring of 2007 to expand MPower's physician volunteer base. Over the past year, MPower and UASOM volunteers have recognized the need to expand the clinic's services to assist the large number of patients who suffer from psychiatric illnesses. This project aims to expand the UASOM-MPower partnership to address the needs of mentally ill clients and promote mental health among the medical clinic's regular patient base.



CALEB MENTZER Edward Via Virginia Osteopathic Medicine

The basis of the project is to survey a variety of patient populations in order to ascertain the most relevant health informational needs during an emergency room visit. From the survey results, educational material will be developed in the regions' most prevalent languages. The printed information will address the determined needs and provide contact information for regional support and advocacy resources. The project will involve my facilitation of collaborative community efforts to distribute surveys, translate material, and disseminate completed educational pamphlets.

Addressing Early Cessation of Breastfeeding in Mexican Immigrants

The purpose of this project is to provide culturally relevant education to the population of interest with the intent to lengthen the duration of exclusive or primary breastfeeding in order to meet two primary goals. Second: to improve infant and child health as a result of the already established beneficial effects of breast milk.

The purpose of this project is to implement changes to the curriculum of the Deaf Health Pathway (DHP) at the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry to include more health promotion and prevention education specific to the needs of the Deaf community

Awareness and Prevention of Youth-onset Type 2 Diabetes

The purpose of this project is to educate youths on the disease process, risk factors, management and long term health complications of diabetes; also to provide health screening and promote healthy lifestyle.



THOMAS TSAI Stanford University Allopathic Medicine

Trauma is the leading cause of death in the US between the ages of 1 and 44 and the third leading cause of mortality across all age groups. My project will address the rise of gang-related violence in East Palo Alto by mentoring middle-school youth. Secondly, using Stanford's state-of-the-art trauma bay simulation center, I hope to engage these teenagers in a real-life simulation of running a trauma in order to illustrate the impact of gang violence.



BONNIE VALLIE University of Massachusetts Allopathic Medicine

Elder Patient Navigator Program

The primary purpose of this program is to provide elder patients with the opportunity to have an Elder Patient Navigator, a trained medical or graduate nursing student, accompany them to medical appointments. The Navigator provides health education as well as a visit summary that elders may refer to after their appointment. This program also aims to improve communication between elders and their providers. An additional function is to provide participating students with an opportunity to interact with a unique population and through these interactions, gain an understanding of the challenges that elder patients face.



TERRA VAUGHN Arizona School of Dentistry and Oral Health Dentistry

Phoenix American Indian Health Education

The purpose of the project is to educate American Indian populations in and around Phoenix, Arizona about systemic disease and related risk factors for oral diseases, and ways to manage both. The education will focus on systemic problems that are more common in American Indian populations such as obesity, diabetes, and heart disease.
