Target Audience: Women between the ages of 21-64 years old, low income, uninsured or underinsured.

Goals/Objective: Partner with Shepherd's Hope Health Center to promote the early detection of breast and cervical cancer screening in low income women in the Central Florida area. (1) Increase cancer screening awareness (2) Promote evidenced-based breast and cervical cancer screening (3) Reduce breast and cervical cancer health disparities (4) Leverage available resources through community partnerships

Description: (Key Partner/Organization Sponsor) Shepherd's Hope Health Center is a faith-based organization that provides access to healthcare for the uninsured or underinsured in Central Florida. It has five free standing health centers in Central Florida.

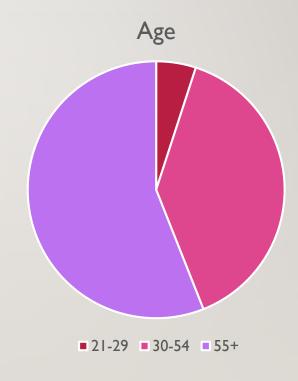

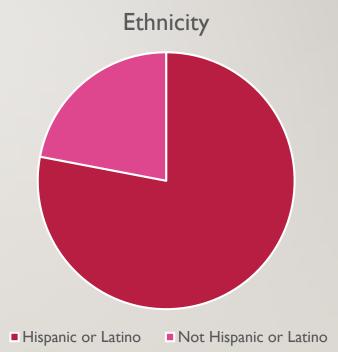
PATIENT'S DEMOGRAPHICS
